SCHOOL GOALS

Goal 1: Literacy

By the end of SY 2023-2024, Garmisch Elementary Middle School will strengthen implementation of College and Career readiness for all students by ensuring all classrooms teaching Literacy skills reflect standards-based instruction as measured by performance on the DoDEA CCR Summative Assessment by a 5% increase (over baseline) yearly of students "meeting or exceeding expectations" and decrease by 3% students in the did not meet or partially met performance levels on SY 21-22 assessment and ORR in grades K-3.


Goal 2: Math



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Ski History and Background

Thrilling Thursday Youth Ski Program 2023-2024

This program is one of the most amazing benefits available to your child while being stationed here in Garmisch. Eight weeks of ski instruction for their PE Class is something well worth investing in. This chance for them to learn a lifelong sport should not be missed and will forever be a fond memory of your child's time here in Garmisch. Who knows, they may well return one day to teach Thrilling Thursday to future generations. Over the years we have hired many instructors who actually got their start at Wonderful Wednesday, now known as Thrilling Thursday.

Read on to find out how to sign up and ***Pray for Snow***

Registration 1, 2, 3.....

- 1. This program will be run by the Edelweiss Lodge and Resort from the Hausberg Ski Lodge.
- 2. Eight Thursday group style ski instruction sessions from 1300-1630, 11 Jan-14 Mar 2024.
- 3. Cost for instruction is **\$240**, thank you GCC! This does not include Transportation, Equipment, or Lift Tickets.
- 4. Transportation to and from school is provided by GEMS.
- 5. Registration and Payments can be made at the Hausberg Lodge from **24-26 November and 9-10 December**, between 0800-1200hrs and 1230-1630 hrs.
- 6. An informational Q&A session will be held at the GEMS on 14 November at 1800hrs.

When is it?

The first Thursday session is 11 January then Thursdays 18, 25 January, 1, 8, 15 February and then a two-week break until 7 March and the last sessions on 14 March 2024.

End of Season Awards Ceremony and Party, 14 March (last day of instruction) @ 1630 hrs. Parents are encouraged to attend.

Sessions cancelled e.g. force protection, weather, etc. will not be rescheduled.

Meet your instructor night:

- **8 January** At the American Hausberg Lodge, 1800-1845 hrs.
- That will also be Taco Night so stick around and enjoy meeting the instructors!
- We *highly suggest* that all participants and parents attend this meeting. It's important for the children and parents to learn about the program and instructor prior to the first ski day.

Ski Passes:

If you have not purchased your season pass here's the process:

- Go to Bayerische Zugspitzbahn @ Olympiastrasse 31 (near the Ice Stadium).
- If you have your old season pass (KEYCARD) bring it with you when you buy your new season pass, to avoid being charged the initial KEYCARD set-up fee.
- * The only lift pass required for the Youth Ski Program is the "Garmisch-Classic" you can pay extra for a 365-day pass from the date of purchase, otherwise your lift pass is only valid for the ski season.
- Bring an I.D. card sized picture (or your passport, so they can scan that picture) for a new KEYCARD.
- Season Passes are cheaper when purchased as a Family.
- BEGINNER SKIERS, or those not considered an avid skier, may want to option out of a season pass and just purchase ½ day passes as needed (at the American Hausberg).
- Parents are responsible for ensuring their child/ren have a lift pass valid for each day's session.

- Sometimes the first few sessions are held in the backyard for beginners and lift passes are not required for this area of instruction.
- Participants **must** have a lift pass in order to use the lifts on the mountain. This is the **responsibility** of the **PARENTS**. If a participant does not have a lift pass, they will not be able to participate and must be picked up from the program.

Equipment Issue:

- If needed, you can obtain ski equipment from the Edelweiss Lodge and Resort ski school at the American Hausberg Lodge from **24-26 November** when registering for the program. Equipment is **\$90** for the season for program participants but **does not include helmet**.
 - Return date is by 1 April 2024. A \$10 per week late fee will apply for any returns after 1 April.
- ¥ You will need about 10-20 minutes per child for fitting. Wear your winter ski socks for the fitting.

Clothing:

- Ensure proper clothing (see clothing and equipment check list)
- Waterproof ski jacket
- Waterproof pants
- Snow gloves
- Goggles
- Helmet

Children will not be allowed on the mountain without these basic safety and clothing items. If a child fails to bring all the necessary items of equipment, they will not be allowed participate and must be picked up from the program.

Helmet and Protective Gear:

Helmets and goggles are <u>mandatory</u> for all participants. It is the responsibility of the participants to *obtain* and *wear* this equipment. GEMS school does have a limited supply of helmets and googles for usage during the program.
